MEETINGS

1. Tuesday, January 21, 2020 Member's night did not disappoint. Paulina Selles presentation on butterflies illustrated by her photographs was most informative. Tumbler Ridge BCN Field Camp photos by Janne Perrin highlighted both flora and geology. Denis Knopp treated us to an aerial view of Camp Slough Wildlife Area taken by Leo Awram's drone. His Spring 2019 photo show included the herring run on Vancouver Island, rare birds, bears, flowers and butterflies. Fernando Selles gave a dissertation on nuts vs berries. Who knew walnuts, almonds and pecans are not nuts!

2. Tuesday, February 18, 2020

Jasper Lament of the Nature Trust of BC (NTBC) presented an informative talk on the 500 properties owned by this organization founded in 1971. Their goal is to secure and sustain biodiverse land for future generations. Nature Chilliwack manages the 8.8 hectare Camp Slough Wildlife Area, acquired in 1994, with NTBC. There are properties at Wells Road and in the Chilliwack River Valley Twenty-eight hectares adjacent to Nicomen Slough were acquired in 2019, The urgency to protect biodiverse lands is escalating in the 21st century forcing NTBC to pay more money for land. Much of their budget goes to land management restoration, invasive removal, signage, monitoring and research.

They saw eagles, swallows, chickadees, bushtits, ruby-crowned kinglets, flickers, song sparrows, towhees, flickers, barred owl, Anna's hummingbirds, geese, woodducks, bufflehead, tiger beetles, mining bees and two species of butterflies. Spring is finally here!
