	hike with some steep sections on natural and gravel trails. Good for		
	children. Elevation gain is ~125 metres.

	2) From the parking lot on Churchill Parkway, the Lookout Loop hike is 2.6		
	km long, taking approximately 1 hour.		
	3) Elevation gain is ~125 metres with some moderately steep sections.		
Seasons to Visit	Year round; visit in dry, sunny weather as steeper sections can be slippery		
	when wet or snow covered and the view is clearer.		
Habitat, Eco system	A moist, mixed coniferous-deciduous forest consisting of western red		
	cedar, Douglas fir, western hemlock and big-leaf maple with scattered		
	mature red cedars.		
Viewing Highlights	In spring and summer, you can bird for woodpeckers, Pacific wren, black-		
	headed grosbeaks, purple finch, thrushes, warblers and other songbirds.		
	Turkey vultures and ravens sometimes ride the thermals above Mt. Tom.		
	Great views of the Fraser Valley towards Abbotsford and south to Cultus		
	Lake. In spring, watch for trilliums and fairy bells along the trail.

Main Access	Take the Prest Road exit #123 south to Teskey Way. Turn left on		
	Promontory Road and follow it uphill until it turns into Extrom Road. Follow		
	Extrom Road to Forester Road to Churchill Parkway.

	2) Trail head is ~2 km from Extrom Rd to Churchill Parkway parking.
